JOB TITLE: ENVIRONMENTAL LAB TECHNICIAN I (Level 1, 2, 3)
DIVISION: ENERGY SUPPLY
DEPARTMENT: FOSSIL GENERATION
GRADE: 9, 10, 12 (PROGRESSIONAL TO GRADE 12)

Job Duties:

An Environmental Laboratory Technician will be assigned analytical and technical duties in the Environmental Lab Group. Typical duties include wastewater sampling and analysis; groundwater monitoring well sampling and analysis, continuous emission monitoring reporting and notifications.

The following qualifications are required for the position:

- Associate Degree in Science; Bachelor Degree in Biology, Chemistry, Geology, Physical Science, Environmental Science or a related technical area; or equivalent (Two years of industrial lab experience including QA/QC).
- Applicant must possess a valid class "C" Texas Drivers license containing no restrictions that would adversely affect the ability to perform job duties. Further, the applicant must maintain an excellent driving record.
- Previous industrial laboratory experience is preferred.
- Applicant must have the ability to read and write, make mathematical calculations, interpret analytical procedures and verbally convey instructions.
- Personal computer (PC) experience in a Windows environment with Microsoft Office applications software.
- The job requires working with, in, or around hazardous chemicals and substances, precision analytical test equipment and bio-hazardous materials.
- Work schedules are subject to workload requirements. Overtime work at night, weekends or holidays may be required.
- Physical requirements:
 - Able to lift 50 pounds routinely in the performance of assigned duties.
 - Distinguish between colors to complete laboratory wet chemistry procedures.
 - Perform work inside the laboratory, the power plants and the outside environments.
 - Job requirements may require working near high voltage equipment, high elevations, all weather conditions and hot noisy areas.
- Pass six-month written, oral and training Environmental Technician I performance examination given by the Energy Supply Environmental Lab Supervisor to demonstrate job knowledge and personal expertise.
- All Environmental Technicians must advance to Level III. Individuals have three years to obtain Level II and an additional 5 years to obtain the Level III. Individuals not meeting the time requirements will be given 90 days to find a different position within CPS. If unable to find a different position within the 90 days, the Environmental Technician will be terminated. (Note: Extensions for extenuating circumstances to these requirements may be approved on a case by case basis by Management.) **RQ 06-0855**
